Some of our long-term Members will be saddened to hear about the death of two of the Society's Founder Members - Anne Carden and Ann Furness. Our condolences go to their families.

We have been approached by a third year veterinary student at the new School of Veterinary Medicine at the University of Surrey, who is currently looking to recruit dogs for her third year project, looking at the effectiveness of laser therapy treatment on elbow dysplasia.

There are two groups for recruitment – dogs with elbow dysplasia who are about to start a course of laser therapy and a group of dogs who are only on painkillers so that we are able to see how effective laser therapy is compared to the 'control' group.

It makes complete sense that most dogs will not be affected, although maybe members with older dogs that may have developed osteoarthritis in their elbows as they have got older.

We are Recruiting Dogs with Elbow Dysplasia for a Study at the University of Surrey Vet School



The purpose of this study is to assess the effect of low-level laser therapy on dogs with elbow dysplasia.

We are looking for dogs who

- Have arthritic elbow pain
- Are at least 6 months of age
- Have no significant hindlimb lameness or other joint arthritic pain
- Have not received surgical intervention for elbow disease in the last six months
- Do not need surgery on a present elbow condition
- Recruitment ends in May 2017



You will be invited to Surrey Vet School Biomechanics Lab in Guildford for three data collection sessions, which will not affect your dog's treatment.

After the kinetic data has been collected you will receive a printout of your dog's paw pressures to see any changes that may have occurred during the course of the study.

This study has been reviewed and received a Favourable Ethical Opinion (FEO) from the University of Surrey NASPA Sub-Committee.
