2016 COMMITTEE NOMINEES

MRS S POUNDS-LONGHURST

My involvement with our lovely breed began in the 1960's but I still actively enjoy the show and working world and caring for the good of the breed both as an individual and through the Society.

I was a founder member and served on the first Executive Committee formed after the inaugural meeting in 1977 and then for several years. I also had the benefit of serving with all three past Presidents on the first Committee, Gwen Medhurst, Robbie Robinson and Brenda Lowe. I spent a further spell on the Executive Committee in the 1990's and then 10 years ago joined the Judges Sub-Committee before being elected to the office of Chair in 2007 from which I am now standing down.

If elected I will be very honoured to accept the role of President for a Society I hold close to my heart, one I have had the longest association with and all it holds dear.

MRS B MILLS

I grew up surrounded by dogs, my paternal grandmother bred Westies, my great aunt Boxers, and my maternal grandfather bred Cairn Terriers in Scotland, so you could say dogs were in my blood. When 5 years old we had a wonderful Golden Retriever called Sherry, who unfortunately died of distemper at quite a young age. Sherry was my shadow and this was the breed I had to have.

In 1980 we were in a position to have our first dog and our Sherry joined us to start our entry into the world of showing and breeding. We also joined the Southern Golden Retriever Society. Sherry was a Ch Camrose Fabius Tarquin daughter and she taught us so much. In 1981 we registered our affix of Millwater and in 1982, we had our first litter.

We ventured into the show ring and were fortunate enough to make up our only champion from our second litter Sh Ch Millwater Bracken (Ch Oystergold Pandorina at Vinecroft x Glennessa Tourri of Millwater) Most of the dogs in our kennel are descended from her, although she died when only 7.

In 1986 I judged my first Open Show and was passed to give C.C.'s in 1993. I have been extremely fortunate to judge in Europe, Canada, Norway, Sweden, New Zealand and had the honour of judging the Australian GRC National in Tasmania in 2006.

In addition to showing, I have enjoyed participating in obedience, and thoroughly enjoyed the working side of our breed.

I was Show Secretary for 5 year and also served on the Committee. I feel extremely honoured to be nominated for Vice President.

MRS C CARTER

I have owned, loved, shown and worked my Golden Retrievers for 34 years. In all that time I have, as far as I can remember been a member of the Southern Golden Retriever Society and served on the Committee as working test Secretary. I have judged at their Working Tests over the years and also been a Trainer at a number of their Training Days.
