WE STILL NEED YOUR HELP

GOLDEN OLDIES PROJECT

As was advised to Members in previous e-news sheets, the BVA have now introduced Glaucoma/PLA testing for Goldens from January20.

Prof Peter Bedford advised that it is now known that PLA is agerelated but the correlation to Primary Glaucoma is still not understood. Some dogs with serious PLA do not go on to develop Glaucoma.

As a result, Prof Bedford is instigating <u>a project to test 500 Goldens</u> <u>aged 8+</u> to gather more evidence with the hope that eventually a DNA test can be achieved. This will be organised by various Breed Clubs around the country holding testing sessions for any members who have dogs 8 or older, and especially any that have actually been diagnosed as having Glaucoma. For the SGRS, our session will be in the Farnham, Surrey area. This will be by appointment and entirely free to volunteers. BUT WE NEED VOLUNTEERS

SO....

If you have any dogs over 8 and would like to volunteer to assist this valuable legacy project for out breed please contact asteph33@aol.com to register your interest and further details will be advised as soon as they are known.

IT DOESN'T MATTTER IF YOUR GOLDEN IS JUST A PET, EVERY ONE OVER 8 CAN CONTRIBUTE TOWARD THE FUTURE HEALTH OF THE BREED, AND EVERY HEALTHY DOG CAN ASSIST IN THIS RESEARCH. WE NEED ENOUGH VOLUNTEERS TO MAKE A TESTING SESSION WORTHWHILE.

If you do have a Golden that has been diagnosed with Glaucoma which is being controlled, that would be especially helpful.
